WARM CRANBERRY WASSAIL Makes 14 6 oz servings.

Ingredients:

1 64 oz. bottle Ocean Spray Cranberry Juice2 1/2 cups apple juice1/4 sugar (optional)

3 3-inch cinnamon sticks

1 tsp. whole allspice 1/2 tsp. ground nutmeg Orange slices and whole cloves for garnish.

Combine all in saucepan except garnish and heat to boiling. Reduce heat and simmer 10 minutes. Strain punch to remove spices Place in heat proof bowl and garnish.

SMALL TAX EXEMPT ORGANIZATIONS NOW REQUIRED TO FILE AN ANNUAL REPORT WITH THE IRS

In 2006 Congress passed the Pension Protection Act of 2006. Among other measures, this act requires all small organizations (Tax Exempt organizations with less than \$25,000.00 in gross revenues) to file an Annual Report electronically, IRS Form 990EZ. This report is due on the 15th day of the 5th month following the organizations year-end. For the NWTA the report is due March 15 of each year commencing March 15, 2009 (for Fiscal Year-end October 31, 2008).

Some NWTA units have tax exempt status and should have received notification from the IRS that the Unit is required to file, annually, an IRS Form 990EZ OR 990-N. If your unit has tax exempt status and you have not received such a notification from the IRS you can get information concerning this at

THE NWTA COAT OF ARMS

Second in a series of articles on the NWTA's organizational history

[Edited by Linnea Bass, based on articles published in the October 1980 and July 1994 issues of the NWTA Courier]

The NWTA Coat-of-Arms was granted through the diligent efforts of Larry Snodgrass, Grenadier Co'y. 42d. Regiment of Foot (RHR), c. 1974-76. It was his application and his funds which obtained this sanc-tion. (Monies were required to accrue the Official Seals affixed to the original document.)

We are indeed honored, in that at the time of its issuance, The American College of Heraldry had never granted Armorial Bearings to a military or quasi-military organization. To our knowledge none have been granted since.



The original text and description follows:

"Be it by these Presents known that a petition hath been submitted unto representatives of the Election Council praying that The North-West Territory Alliance, Chartered by the State of Illinois, be elected as a Corporate Fellow of The American College of Heraldry and that suitable and appropriate Armorial Bearings be devised and appointed by Grant. The Council, acting under the authority of the Board of Governors, duly sur-veyed the petition and deemed the Corporation to be eminently qualified for election. It is, therefore, with plea-sure that We recognize the Body as a Corporate Fellow and do hereby grant Armorial Bearings to wit:

Quarterly 1. Argent, issuant from a tuft of grass, a pine tree Vert between, in pale two scrolls Or, fimbriated and

inscribed respectively "LIBERTY TREE" and "AN APPEAL TO HEAVEN" Sable; 2. Gules the cypher above the Roman numeral III Or and ensigned with a Royal Crown Proper; 3. Azure, a fleur-de-lis Or; 4. Azure, a bear rampant reguardant, incensed and barry of Gules and Argent, grasping in the dexter paw a sword Or; over all a fillet cross Or. Above the Shield is placed a Helmet with a Mantling Gules doubled Argent, and on a Wreath Argent and Gules is set for Crest, an eagle's head erased Argent, armed Or, and in an Escrol above the same this Motto "Vi Et Armis" [By Force and Arms], and in an Escrol below the Shield this Motto "That Others May Learn" and set thereupon for Supporters, to the dexter an eagle and to the sinister a lion Or. For a badge, a torteau charged with an eagle's head erased Argent, armed Or, all within a belt Azure, buckled, embellished and inscribed "By Force and Arms" Or.

The sole uses of said Arms are restricted to the Corporation which will hereafter exercise singular and exclusive rights and title through the Chief Executive. In testimony thereof, this Grant of Arms hath executed and the President hath hereunto set his hand and seal and hath affixed the seal of The College before Almighty God and this company of Armigers."

HOLIDAYS AT THE HEARTH, CONTINUED

PUMPKIN PUDDING

Combine 2 cups cooked mashed pumpkin and 3 tablespoons butter. Mix well. Add 3 eggs and 1 cup sugar or 3/4 cup honey, 1/3 cup milk, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon

cinnamon, and 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg. Mix Well. Add 1 teaspoon vanilla. Pour into greased baking dish.

Preheat dutch oven for a few minutes, place trivet in bottom, and then pudding. Put coals on lid, and have a 1/4 turn revolution every every 15 minutes. Bake 1 1/2 to 2 hours. Lift lid to let steam out
